



What are Docents?

Docents are volunteers who greet our guests for every MAI art exhibit. A Docent is the first person guests see when attending an exhibit. They provide a feeling of welcome and enthusiasm for the art our guests are about to view.

What else does a Docent do?

An important task of a docent is to make sure all the guests attending our exhibits sign our guest book. This helps the MAI determine the number of attendees, to assess the success of the exhibit.



This information helps the MAI establish the exhibit calendar for future years.

Docents ensure that all guests have exhibit programs which help make the viewing more fulfilling. Another important task for the docent is to answer questions. These questions may range from the location of restrooms in the facility to the identity of some of the Manistee dignitaries such as T.J. Ramsdell or T. Walter Hardy. They also answer questions regarding the art, artists or specific pieces in the exhibit. Docents participate in an "orientation meeting" at the beginning of each exhibit year. They also have the opportunity to view and become familiar with exhibits during the set-up. Newer docents are paired with more experienced people to make the learning process easier. The MAI is extremely grateful to our Docents. They are an important part of our team. Without these volunteers, the MAI would not be able to support extended display times for guests to view the wonderful art. It is an enthusiastic group of volunteers that truly enjoy art and help provide our exhibit patrons with a rewarding experience.



What is a Site Manager?

The city of Manistee owns and manages the Ramsdell Theater Complex and requires that we have a site manager present during all exhibit hours. Basically, a site manager oversees the building activity and secures the area at exhibit's end. The City has training sessions for this task. 



A current collection of over a hundred art works are housed by the MAI when they are not out on loan to local venues such as banks, offices, City Hall and the Chamber of Commerce. Art on loan is rotated giving the venue a fresh face every four months. 
